WIOD data construction meeting, 3-4 December 2009, Paris

This small-group meeting is jointly organised with the OECD. The aim of the Paris-meeting is to bring together a small group of dedicated data-experts to discuss the progress being made and the problems encountered so far, outline the agenda for the future, and exchange information on complementary data construction projects such as the efforts made by OECD, GTAP and WTO. The meeting will be strongly focused on statistical and technical issues surrounding the construction of inter-regional IO tables and will contain five sessions spread over two days: WIOD overview; trade databases; IO-tables; multiregional tables; and satellite accounts (environmental and socio-economic).
